The next 3 ends up to 18 saw our usual push and the Kent lead dropped to just 2 shots thanks mainly to unanswered gains by the rinks skipped by Leo May and Peter Ward.

The score could not be closer and it was all down to the last few woods on Russell Morgan's rink with a one shot Hampshire lead overall on the match. The Kent skip played a great last wood to set up a match winning lie of three shots but Russell's last wood secured second shot an overall draw at 120 shots each with Hampshire winning on four rinks to two by Kent and a points win of 13 points to 9.

A tough opposition and a great performance to leave us 22 points ahead of Kent who still have a game in hand next Saturday away to Oxfordshire.
